1. Grammar:
 - The Noun – gender, number agreement . The Article – morphology. contraction
 - The Qualifying Adjective – gender and number agreement. Most common reflexive verbs
 - Personal, demonstrative, indefinite, interrogative, possessive pronouns and quantifiers
 - Most common ordinal and cardinal numbers - Formation and agreement
 - General use of "ser" and "estar"
 - Verb Tenses – the Present simple, Gerund and present perfect
 - Periphrasis of obligation: "tener que, debe, hay que"
2. Funcional contents
 - General information – identifying, describing and comparing people, places, objects, states
 - Referring to habitual or present,
 - Asking for opinions about someone or something.
 - Expressing obligation, permission and possibility. Inviting and offering something.
 - Expressing and asking about likes, interests, enjoyment, satisfaction, wishes and preferences
 - Time and place references – habit and frequency markers, proximity and distance markers
 - Produce short texts and speeches in the professional context.
3. Vocabulary - topic areas
 - Social habits – family, neighbours, professionals, friendship relations; relations with strangers
 - Different types of housing . Means of transport; Daily life
 - Shopping and business, Public places Leisure – entertainment and show performances
 - Physical and Psychological description
 - Airport: professions, objects, documents and locations.
 - Hotel: services, professions, hotel typology
 - Tourists: typology of passenger cars. Clothes for traveling
4. Cultural contents:
 - Hispanic and Hispanic American culture. Countries, currencies and languages.
 - The names, nicknames and courtesy in the Hispanic world and Spain
 - Tourist and cultural patrimony of special Spanish relevance
